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Ways to Use these Pages

Color Palettes

- Prismacolor and Copic Color Palettes: Use the color palettes inspired by the original book's illustrations as references for selecting marker colors while coloring the pages. Experiment with different coloring techniques such as shading, blending, and layering to bring your coloring pages to life. Start with light strokes and gradually build up the colors to avoid bleeding through.

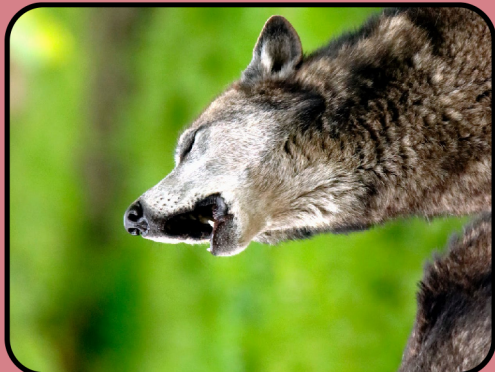



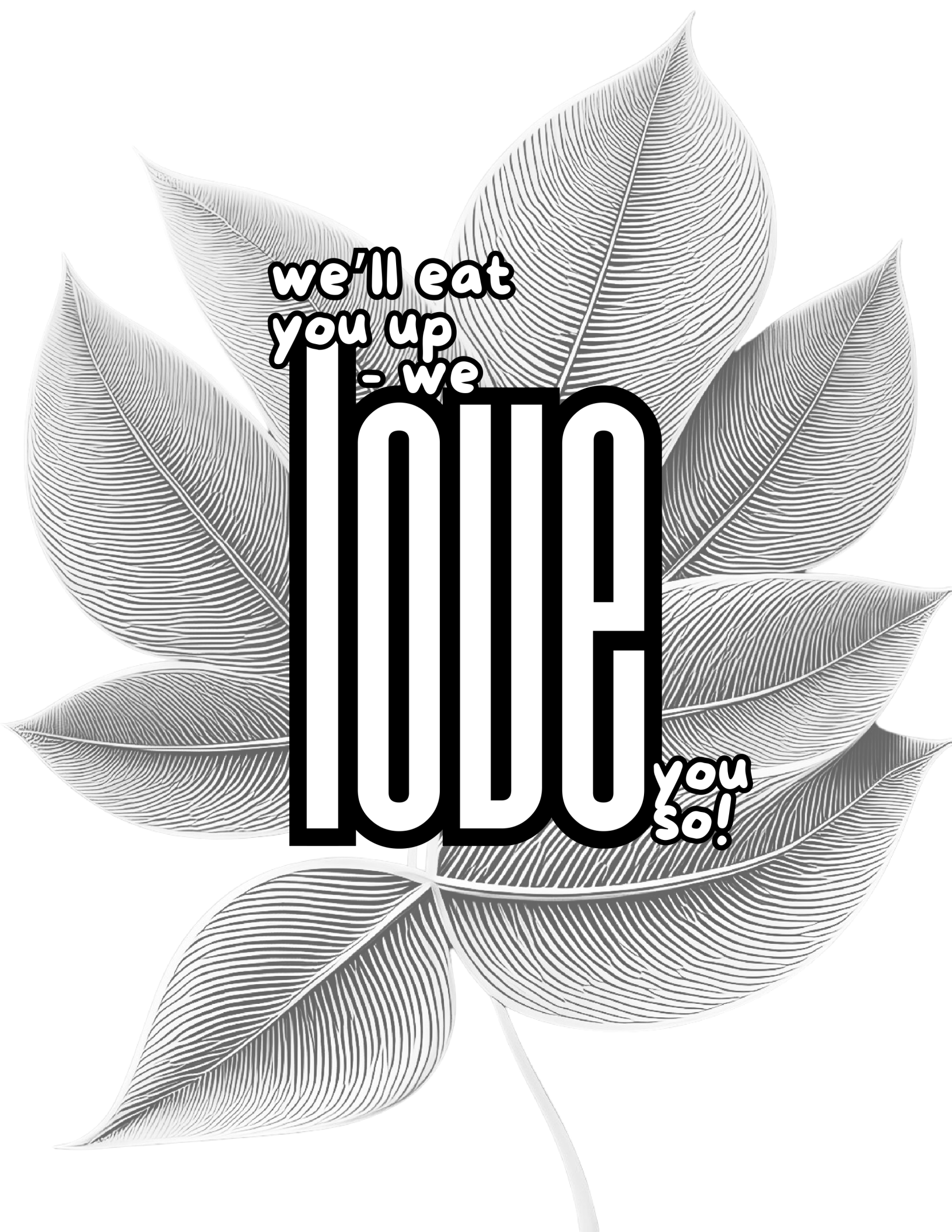
